## 7 Strategies of a Good Reader

Make Connections	Visualize	Predict	Summarize
Good readers notice pieces of the text that <b>relate to what they know or what they have experienced</b>	Good readers <b>create pictures in their minds</b> while they read. Use your senses to connect to the <b>characters, events,</b> and <b>ideas</b> to clarify the picture in your head.	Good readers think about <b>what's going to happen</b> and make predictions based on <b>what they already know</b> and <b>what they have read</b>	Good readers identify the most <b>important ideas</b> and <b>restate</b> them in their <b>OWN words</b>
Connect the text to... - <b>self</b> = own experiences - <b>text</b> = compare to other authors or books - <b>world event</b> = from newspaper/ TV source	-Create a mental <b>picture</b> - <b>Draw</b> what one sees -Use a <b>letter visual</b>	-Make <b>inferences</b> (educated guess) based on what was read -Use the <b>title, heading, pictures,</b> or <b>charts</b> to predict	-Determine <b>important ideas</b> - <b>Highlight</b> key words or events -Use <b>post-its</b> to retell ideas -Write a 25-word <b>abstract</b>

Good readers stop to <b>think about their reading</b> and they <b>know what to do when they don't understand</b>		Good readers <b>stop</b> to understand what they read and <b>fix any comprehension problems</b>	Good readers combine <b>new information</b> from their reading with <b>existing knowledge</b> in order to form new ideas or interpretations.
-Ask <b>questions</b> to check for understanding or comprehension -Use <b>resources</b> to answer questions		<b>-Re-read</b> -Use <b>context clues</b> -Make <b>predictions</b> and later <b>confirm or reject</b> them based on further reading	-Determine the <b>big picture</b> <b>-Bring the information all together</b> to get the main idea
